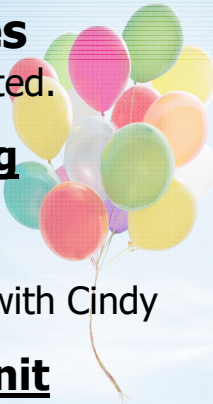

Person Centre Care Initiatives

DementiAbility- uses details about our resident's past and present and observations of their current behaviours to adapt the environment and our approach to improve their quality of life.

GPA:- Gentle Persuasive Approach is an education program that provides staff with the knowledge, skills and confidence to support persons with dementia and responsive behaviours and to use gentle and respectful physical redirection.

Research projects with UBC IDEA lab:

We are part of 3 research projects that use dementia friendly technology to lessen negative behaviours associated with dementia.

1. Zinnia TV- dementia friendly programming used on TV, Ipad and in an immersive reality setting. To provide an appropriate and engaging environment for residents with dementia.
2. Silent Disco Headphones- explore whether music delivered by silent disco headphones can support mental health and well-being among people with dementia. The project started in June, 35 staff attended a focus group on June 14 and an average of 16 residents were involved in the study over 4 sessions.
3. Immersive virtual reality- is the use of ceiling mounted projectors as an alternative to Virtual reality headsets when presenting immersive content. The Steveston lounge now has a ceiling mounted projector and the residents have the Zinnia TV immersive content.

Building Updates

- Telus Fibre optic upgrade – all Fibre optic hardware and wiring has been installed and is ready to switch. Awaiting Telus final audit and testing before system is switched over to Fibre. Anticipated to be done by Mid June.
- LDR Engineering updated Facility condition report has been completed – new long term Capital plan is now in planning stages.
- New Cedar Pergola under construction in East Courtyard. Old pergola moved and refurbished at its new location in the South west courtyard.

In the works

- Water bottle filler /water fountain near staff room
- Tiered planters for SCU courtyard
- Weigh scale for the SCU building.
- New Ice making machine for the main kitchen.
- Automated blinds for the Lobby skylights to control heat in the summer months.
- Full cleaning of all HVAC ducts and systems
- Fire panel annunciators' replacement by Chubb Edwards summer of 2024.

Heat Plan

It is expected to be a hot summer. VCHA defines a Heat emergency as the indoor temperature above 26 degrees.

Main building air conditioning:

1st fl - Common areas, dining room and hallways have A/C
2nd floor- common areas. 2nd fl resident rooms have portable AC- Please monitor temperature and turn the A/C down in cooler weather or at night.

SCU - Common areas, dining room and hallways have A/C. Family is requested to provide hats, sunscreen and fans for residents who need them.

If outdoor temp is 29 degrees or hotter-residents will remain inside. Hydration stations are in the lounges and staff bring a hydration cart to residents in their rooms in the afternoon.
